The Anne Gayles-Felton Endowed Scholarship Award

Award Description

The **Anne Richardson Gayles-Felton Endowed Scholarship** is awarded annually to an undergraduate secondary education major who demonstrates promise not only as a future teacher, but also as a potential teacher educator. The scholarship is administered by the **Association of Teacher Educators (ATE)** in partnership with the **Leadership Foundation for Teacher Education (LFTE)**. The recipient is recognized during the ATE Annual Meeting and Awards Banquet.

Award History

This scholarship was established in **2013** by **Dr. Anne Richardson Gayles-Felton**, a distinguished member of ATE with more than **50 years of meritorious service**. Dr. Gayles-Felton has been a long-standing leader in teacher education, with active involvement in the **Association of Student Teaching (AST)**, the **Southeastern Regional Association of Teacher Educators (SRATE)**, and the **Florida Association of Teacher Educators (FATE)**. Her vision and dedication continue to inspire future generations of educators and teacher educators.

Eligibility and Expectations

- Must be enrolled as a **Secondary Education major** in an accredited teacher education program
 - Must be **nominated by an ATE member**
 - Must have a **minimum GPA of B+ or higher**
 - Recipient is expected to:
 - **Register for and attend** the ATE Annual Meeting and Awards Banquet the year they are honored
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Nomination and Application Process

A complete application must include:

1. **Evidence of Participation**
 - Documented proof of at least **three years of sustained participation** in a student organization emphasizing teaching (e.g., Future Teachers, Student Education Associations, Young Educators Society, etc.; pre-college organizations may also be included).
2. **Letters of Recommendation (2 total)**
 - One from a **university professor**
 - One from a **school-based professional** (e.g., teacher, principal, guidance counselor, coach, dean, curriculum coach)

3. Personal Writing Artifact

- A **1–1.5 page original writing sample** authored by the applicant (typed, not handwritten)
 - May take the form of a **goal statement** or **philosophy of education**
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Review Process

Applications are reviewed and the recipient is selected by the **Leadership Foundation for Teacher Education (LFTE) Advisory Council**.
