Award Description

The **Robert F. Schuck Distinguished Research in Teacher Education Award** recognizes and promotes exceptional research that makes a substantial contribution to the improvement of teacher education. Through this award, the Association of Teacher Educators seeks to:

1. Encourage research that advances the development of teacher education.
2. Support the dissemination of research findings nationally and internationally.
3. Expand the knowledge base of teacher education.

Award History

This award was established in honor of **Robert F. Schuck** to recognize his lasting contributions to teacher education and to encourage rigorous scholarship that strengthens the field.

Eligibility and Expectations

- Articles may be submitted by the **author(s)** or nominated by a **reader**.
- Authors do **not** need to be members of ATE.
- Eligible articles must:
 - Report **empirical research** directly related to teacher education.
 - Be **published** (or accepted and scheduled for publication, with official notification) in a **peer-reviewed journal** within two years of the submission deadline.
 - Not exceed **25 pages** (excluding references).
- Recipients are expected to:
 - **Register for and attend** the ATE Annual Meeting and Awards Banquet.
 - **Present** their research during the year they are honored.

Nomination and Application Process

A complete submission must include:

1. **PDF copy** of the published or accepted article.
2. **Cover page** with the following information:
 - Title of the article
 - Name(s) of the author(s)
 - Journal title, issue, and date of publication
 - Complete contact information for all authors:
 - Name, title, institution

- Mailing address, telephone number, email
 - Name and contact information of the nominator (if different from the author)

Review Process

The **Research Sub-Committee of the Educational Programs and Planning Committee** reviews all submissions. Articles are evaluated on:

- Clarity and persuasiveness of the research problem/question and rationale
 - Appropriateness and rigor of the theoretical framework and methods
 - Quality and persuasiveness of conclusions and interpretations considering reported data
 - Significance of implications for teacher education
 - Overall quality of writing
